

REMINDERS:

- Children must be signed in and out daily using ProCare. Please, leave any necessary drop off notes for your child's teacher before signing them in (use document button on top right).
- FLU SHOTS DUE BEFORE DEC. 31st all children missing proof of flu will be excluded from school starting January 1st until the vaccine is received or exemption letter signed.
- Please, ensure your child has extra clothes, shoes, underwear, and other necessary supplies in their cubby daily that are age and weather appropriate. Swap summer for Winter!
- The children will go outside each day per state guidelines unless the wind chill factor is too cold. The weather is checked each morning and afternoon. There is an alternate gym schedule for the days with inclement weather.
 - o Winter coats required daily; hats, gloves, and scarves are encouraged.

Fun Family Winter Activities



Learning Snowball Toss: When we have snowy weather, try sticking letters, numerals, and/or shape stickers to a tree. Show your child how to make snowballs and have them try to throw their snowball to the letter, number, or shape that you call out. This will help with recognition development and is a great gross motor activity that uses hand-eye-coordination. This activity can be expanded into a matching game where you put two of the same item on the tree and have them throw a snowball at each one to match them.

Snow Spraying Art: Try filling empty spray bottles with a combination of food coloring and water. Have your child squirt the snow outside and explore the colored snow they created. They can make mess free art that encourages fine motor development and builds hand muscles. This is a great building block for writing and learning how to hold a pencil. Not only is this activity mess free but it allows for imagination and open discussions about science. You can always revisit your child's snow art when the snow melts and see what's left.
